# COVID-19 AND JURY DUTY NATIONAL OMNIBUS OPINION SURVEY






#### **TOPLINE FINDINGS**

- Canadians willingness to Serve on a Jury post-COVID-19 is low, behind only Volunteering at a Hospital
- More Canadians were willing to Donate Blood, or Volunteer for a Community Organization than Serve on a Jury
- Canadians see Jury Duty as less important to society than Donating Blood, and Volunteering for a Community Organization
- Half of Canadians are <u>unwilling</u> to sit in Close Proximity on a Jury, second only to Riding in a Crowded Elevator post-COVID-19
- In the past-two-weeks amid COVID-19, more than six-in-ten Canadians said they were Worried about Being in Public Places




## Canadians willingness to serve on a Jury post-COVID-19 is low, behind only Volunteering at a Hospital






## Canadians see Jury Duty as less important to society than Donating Blood, and Volunteering for a Community Organization








